Would love to have any glossy magazines, that you may be sending to the recycling, for a collage project they will be doing next term.

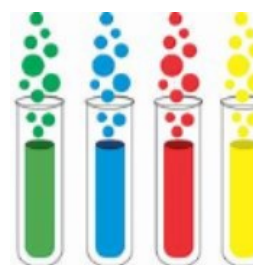
