Through this time their input has been invaluable. Seeing us through Ofsted and Covid amongst many other challenges. We would like to thank them both for their dedication and support of the school.

Attendance

Please see below the very important information on penalty notices for absence, issued by the DFE. These will be in force from September 2024. The criteria has been narrowed and fines must now be considered statutorily in numerous circumstances. Please take the time to read the information and consider its impact upon your child's attendance. Term time holidays of 5 days or more will result in notice to improve letters. Please note that where children are reported ill to school and school have reason to believe that the absence was in fact a holiday, this can result in the issuing of a notice to improve letter before a fine being issued. Attached to the newsletter is further information. The school will update its policy and procedure to be in line with these regulations from September 2024. The changes are:

- There will be a new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered.
- 2. The new rules mean you will no longer be able to take your child out of school for one week's holiday without the consideration of a penalty notice being issued.
- 3. There will be an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.
- 4. If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.
- 5. If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider other enforcement options available to them. This could include prosecution.

SCHOOL MEALS

The new menu is now on our website and will start on our return in September.

Meals will continue to be charged at £2.65 each. Children in Treen and Mousehole classes received Universal Infant free school meals. If you think you might be entitled to income-related free school meals please go to the Cornwall Council website to apply.
