I was lucky to be one of 70 teachers selected from 500 applicants to attend the 3-day Parliament Teacher Ambassador Programme and can now proudly say I am a Parliament Teacher Ambassador. This means that I have received in-depth training about how our Parliament works. I learnt a lot about the history of our government and how parliament operates today. I had behind the scenes tours of both the House of Commons, House of Lords and the Supreme Court. I was also lucky enough to meet and speak to some

key people who work in Westminster, notably Sarah Davies who manages all of the operations in the Chambers, The Right Honourable Sir Lindsey Hoyle who is the speaker in the House of Commons, as well as the speaker of the Lords, several MPs and a House of Commons Security Door Key Keeper. Hearing from these people gave me an insight into the many different roles around Parliament and different ways that we can inspire our children to get involved. I also learnt all about how to use our school council as a learning tool for understanding the British Parliament and democracy. My next step is to work towards achieving Gold Ambassador Status for our school by sharing the knowledge that I have learnt with both the children and the adults.
