#### SCHOOL VALUES AND BRITISH VALUES

Each week in our assemblies we have a focus on a different school value and a different British value. This is part of our personal development offer, the aim of which is to help the children become successful adults and citizens. The values are shared at the start of each assembly and our theme for the week will be linked to them. For example in Key Stage 2 this week the children were told about Holocaust Memorial day which takes place today, 27th January. They discussed how learning about our British Value of, Respect for Different Faiths and Beliefs, and our school values of Respect and Kindness helps us to ensure that as future generations we can learn from the past and build a safer world. We then also think about how we can demonstrate these values in our lives in school and at home. Extra house points and raffle tickets are then available all week for pupils who show they are working hard on demonstrating



that value. Moving forward we will share our weekly values on the newsletter to keep parents informed.

Uniform - A gentle reminder to all parents about uniform. Our school colour is bright red. Trousers, pinafore dresses or skirts should be grey/black and shirts should be white. Shoes should be black with sensible heels. During the summer children may wear red and white gingham check dresses or may wear grey/black shorts. For PE we wear black jogging bottoms or shorts with a white T-shirt and school sweatshirt or hoodie. Please ensure your child's school clothes are as close to this a possible.

### Strep A

A further case this week, so a reminder of the symptoms to look out for, which include:

a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. This is followed by a fine red rash which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. On more darkly-pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'. The face can be flushed red but pale around the mouth.

If you think you, or your child, have scarlet fever or Strep A:

see your GP or contact NHS 111 as soon as possible

make sure that you/your child takes the full course of any antibiotics prescribed by the doctor

stay at home, away from nursery, school or work for at least 24 hours after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection.


