This week, we've shone a light on Anti-Bullying, joining schools across the country in promoting kindness and respect. Children took part in a Random Act of Kindness Bingo

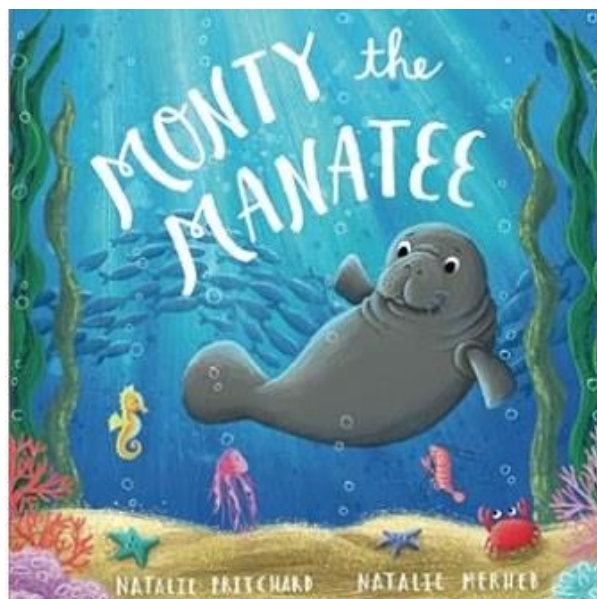
Challenge, aiming to complete thoughtful tasks throughout the week. Those who filled their bingo cards were awarded a special sticker on Friday to celebrate their efforts.

Parking Safety Reminder

We all want to keep our school community safe, and recently the car park has become very busy again since the scaffolding was taken down. The wet weather hasn't helped, as everyone understandably wants to park closer to school. To support us, our local neighbourhood policing officer will visit on Wednesday to deliver a road safety session and share advice on next steps.

In the meantime, please help us by following these simple rules:

- Drive slowly and carefully at all times around the area.
- Do not block access routes or emergency exits or park on the pavements
- Be mindful of pedestrians, especially children.
- Please do not park directly in front of school – this makes the road very narrow and causes queuing.
- Only enter the car park if you have a blue badge and have registered this with school.
- Parents should only pick up at home time from one side of the gate (even if you have parked in the car park) – this is to keep children safe.
- Please only drive off the car park once all children have been dismissed, we are limited on space and ensure children have gone before any vehicles move.

Child Health Programme 25/26 Year 6

We know how important your child's health is to you. The Child Health Programme is a great way to find out information that helps you to keep your child healthy.

Health review with the School Nursing Team **0-19 Children's Services**

The School Nurses belong to Children's Public Health Services working alongside other Public Health Nurses such as the Health Visiting Team. The School Nursing service offers parents/carers the opportunity for their child to have a health review during Reception Year and Year 6 at school. They also offer additional School Nurse Health assessments throughout your child's school years via the Early Help Hub.

The School Nursing team provide confidential support and advice that promotes the best possible health and educational outcomes for your child.

The School Nursing team can support you with children's physical and emotional health. For example, they can help you if you have concerns about your child's emotional health or continence problems (night and day time wetting) keeping a healthy weight, healthy eating and lifestyle, and supporting their health needs in school. We support you alongside other professionals such as family workers, speech and language, emotional well-being professionals, school SEN staff.



School nurses have four main roles:

- To give confidential advice and care to young people and their parents or carers
- To support young people to look after their physical and emotional health
- To direct young people to the right services
- To guide and support children transitioning into secondary education

Here to help you and your child
We can help you with or refer you for:

- Health assessments
- Healthy eating/lifestyle
- Supporting a school where a child has a health condition
- Supporting you alongside other professionals such as family workers, speech and language, emotional well-being professionals, school SEN staff.

A Note on Outstanding Payments

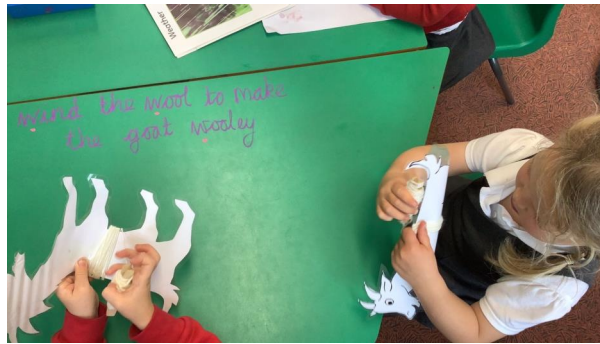

Mousehole Class Updates

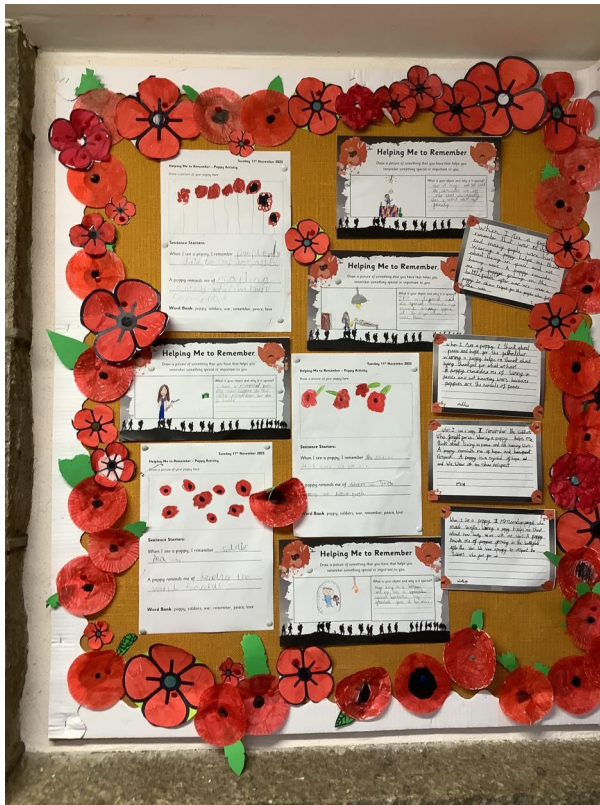

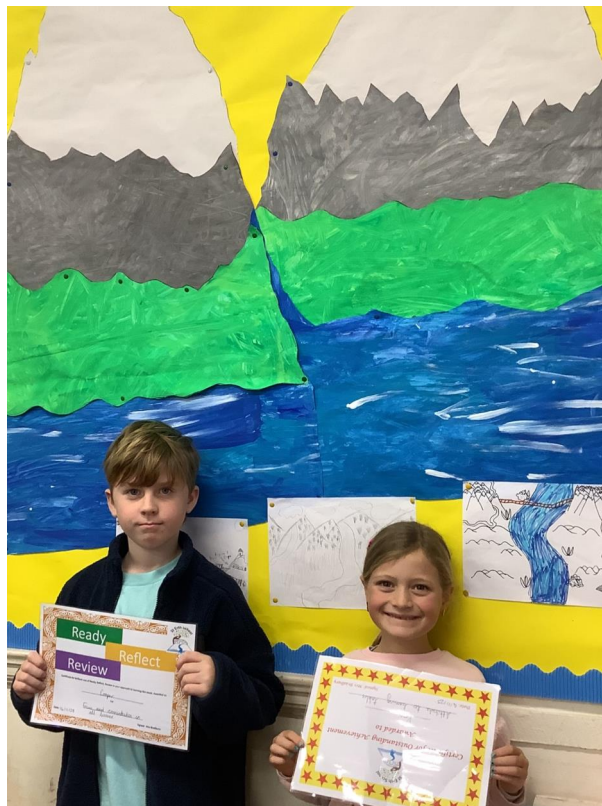
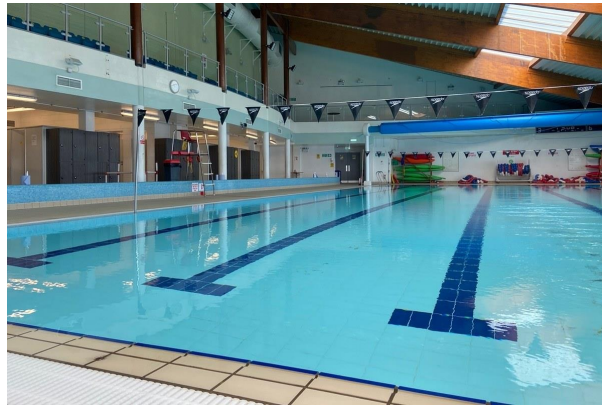

To give your child an extra boost with their learning, they can log into:

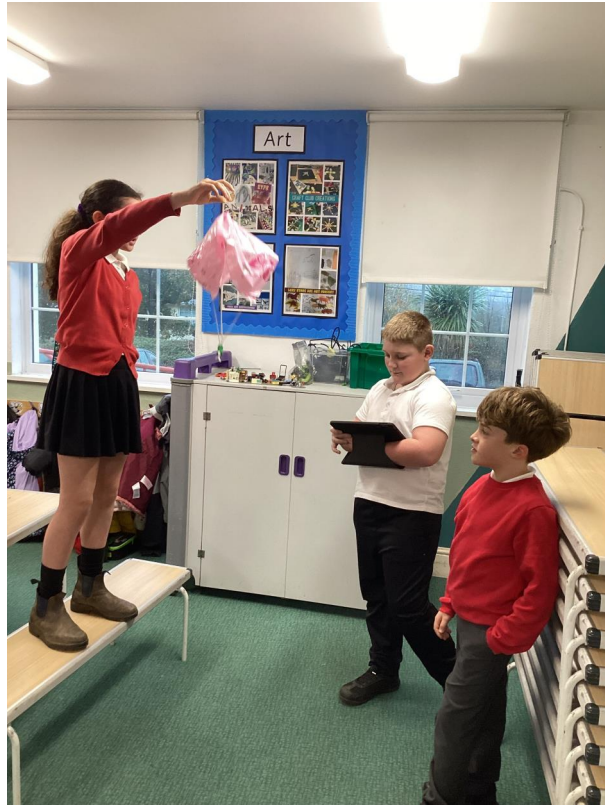
Doodle Spellings, Doodle Maths, and Doodle Tables – These intuitive apps adapt to your child's learning level and offer personalised activities based on previous progress.

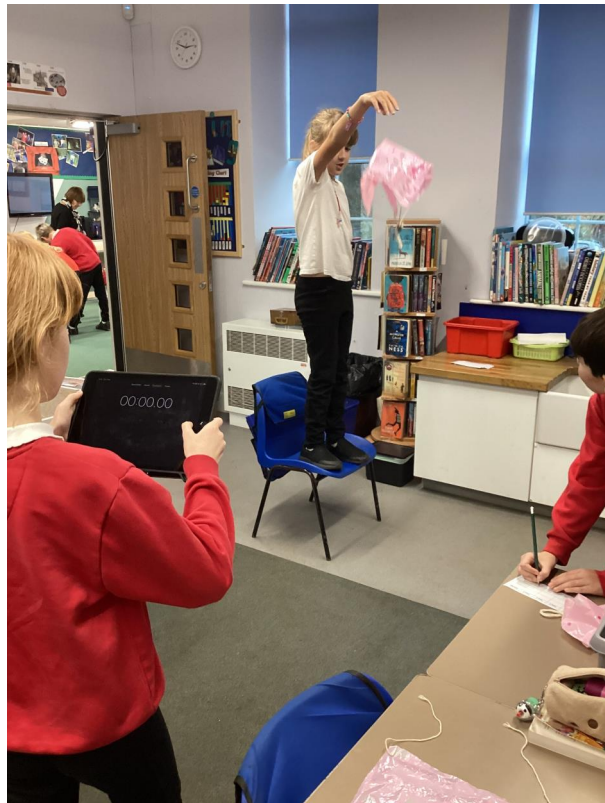
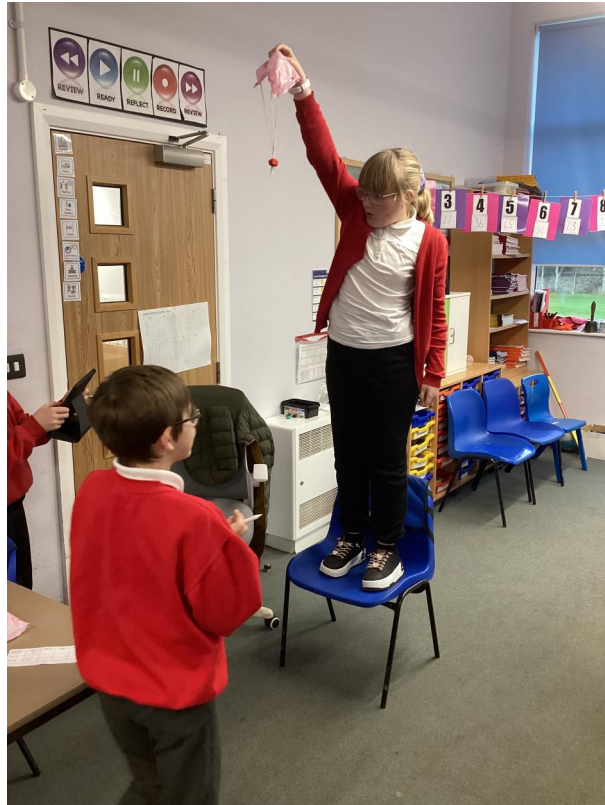
Times Table Rockstars – We currently subscribe to this platform, and there is an ongoing competition between Year 5 and Year 6 students!

Great News About Attendance!

We're delighted to share some fantastic attendance news for this term:

1. Attendance is improving!

Our current attendance for Years 1–6 is **97.2%**, which is above both the national average (95.7%) and the local authority average (95.5%).

2. Persistent absence is very low

Only **4.5%** of pupils are persistently absent, which is much better than most similar schools.

3. Every small improvement matters

If we meet our attendance target of **95.1%** for the year, pupils will gain at least **71 extra school days** compared to last year.

4. Strong days and areas to focus

Attendance is excellent on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings and Thursday afternoons (around **98%**), but we'd like to improve Fridays and Year 1 attendance. Please support us with this by always attending a 'Fun Time Friday!'

5. Working together makes the difference

Good attendance means better learning and wellbeing. Please keep supporting us by ensuring children are in school every day unless they are genuinely unwell.

Music Lessons with Cornwall Music Service Trust



Did you know you can book affordable music lessons for your child to attend at school. There are lots of instruments to choose from, and there is currently plenty of availability for woodwind instruments, so if your child is interested in learning Clarinet, Flute, Saxophone, Oboe, Recorder, Dood or Toot or a wide range of other instruments check out the below on how to book.

To book lessons please click on the link below and select 'St Erth Community Primary School' as the school and 'woodwind' as the lesson type. Instruments are available to hire from CMST for a termly fee or the woodwind music teacher can advise on purchasing an instrument - new or second hand. Lessons start from around £6 a week for group lessons but individual lessons are also available. If your child is in receipt of free school meals/ Pupil Premium or you are in receipt of certain benefits then select this in the payment category and lessons are heavily subsidised. Important Information

How is a Penalty Notice paid?

Penalty notices can be paid by card by calling the office on 01872 324201. If the 21st/28th day for payment falls on a weekend or bank holiday, payment will be accepted at the same rate on the following working day.

What happens if a Penalty Notice is not paid?

If a Penalty Notice is not paid within the 28 days of issue (as per the dates listed on the Penalty Notice), Cornwall Council will progress the matter to the Magistrates Court, for the offence of failing to ensure regular attendance, NOT for failure to pay the fine.

If found guilty:

- under section 444(1), it can result in the parent being fined up to £1000
- under section 444(1A), it can result in the parent being fined up to £2,500 and/or receiving a custodial sentence of up to 3 months.

Cornwall Council may also apply for costs incurred in taking the matter to court.

Penalty Notices

A guide to Education Welfare Services
for parents and carers



What is a Penalty Notice?

A penalty notice is a fine that can be issued under section 444A and section 444B of the Education Act 1996. The fine is issued per parent, per child for:

- Leave of absence of 10 school sessions (5 days or more within any rolling 10 school week* period during term time, without authorisation from the school. This can include unauthorised absence for a holiday.
- Unauthorised absence of 10 or more sessions (5 days or more within any rolling 10 school week* period where a parent fails to provide an explanation for the absence, or where an explanation is provided but the school consider it insufficient to authorise the absence.
- Unauthorised lateness of 10 school sessions within any rolling 10 school week* period, whereby a child arrives at school after the registers have closed.

NB A penalty notice can be issued for any combination of the above reasons where there are 10 sessions (5 school days or more of unauthorised absence within any rolling 10 school week period. The unauthorised absence can be consecutive or non-consecutive and can span over two terms (including between academic years).

Or when:

- A pupil is observed in a public place during school hours in the first five school days of a period of exclusion from school, without reasonable justification.

* A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.

Who can be issued with a Penalty Notice?

Parents and carers of a child can be issued with a Penalty Notice. The definition of a "parent" as set out in section 57B of the Education Act 1996. By virtue of this section "parent" includes: all natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person who lives with and looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.

How much is a Penalty Notice fine?

As of the 15th of August 2024, a penalty notice is £80 if paid within 21 days. If the fine is not paid in 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.

If a second penalty notice is issued to the same parent for the same child within a three-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.

If a parent then commits a third offence in a three-year rolling period, Cornwall Council will need to consider other enforcement options available. This could include prosecution under section 444(1) or section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996. If found guilty a parent would receive a criminal record and substantial fine.

Penalty Notices are issued per parent, per child.

Therefore, if there are two parents and two children, the fines will total £320 if paid within 21 days or £640 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days (or for a second offence).

Can a Penalty Notice be paid in instalments?

No. Penalty Notices must be paid in full, within the designated dates. However, if a parent has more than one child and is therefore issued with more than one fine, they can pay the fines separately if they wish.

Who is responsible for issuing Penalty Notices?

It is a Headteacher's decision whether or not to authorise an absence and, if their decision is not to authorise, they have the right to request a Penalty Notice in line with their attendance policy process. Cornwall Council's role is to check that the evidence submitted is compliant with Cornwall Council's Code of Conduct for Education Related Penalty Notices and, if so, to issue as appropriate.

Can a parent appeal a Penalty Notice?

There is no statutory right of appeal once a Penalty Notice has been issued. If you believe that the Penalty Notice should not have been issued, you should make contact with the school or academy that your child attends at your very earliest convenience after receiving the Penalty Notice. 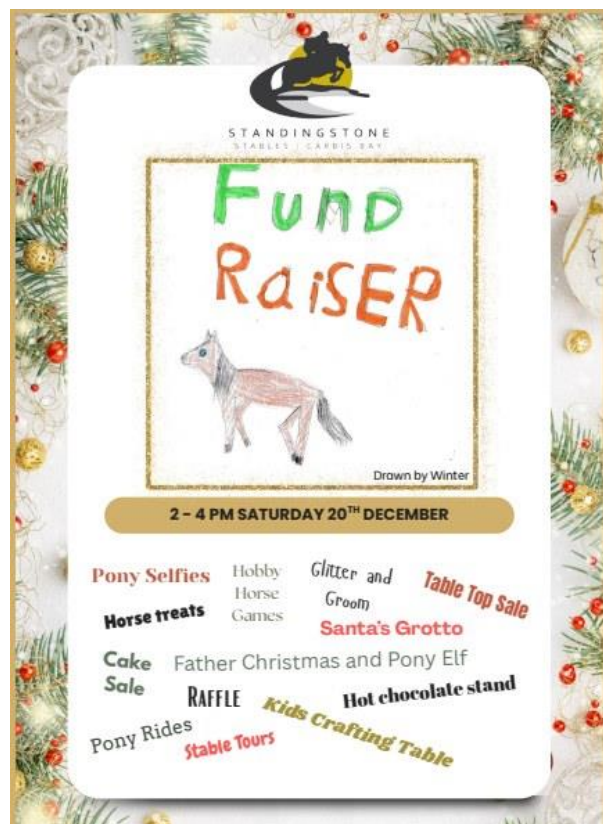
