We are still missing many of these forms which were sent home a couple of weeks ago. If you still haven't returned yours please can you send in on Monday. Thanks.

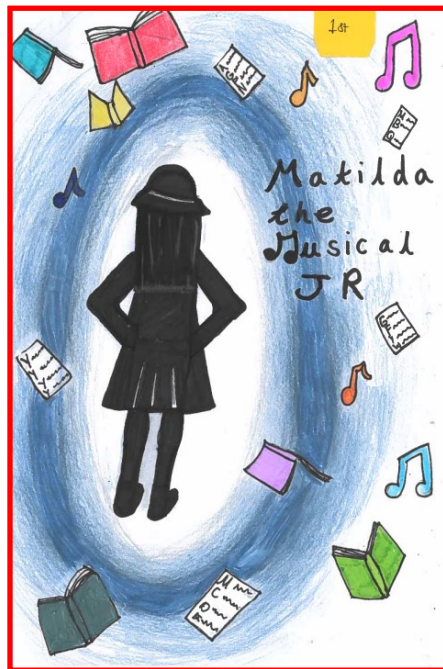

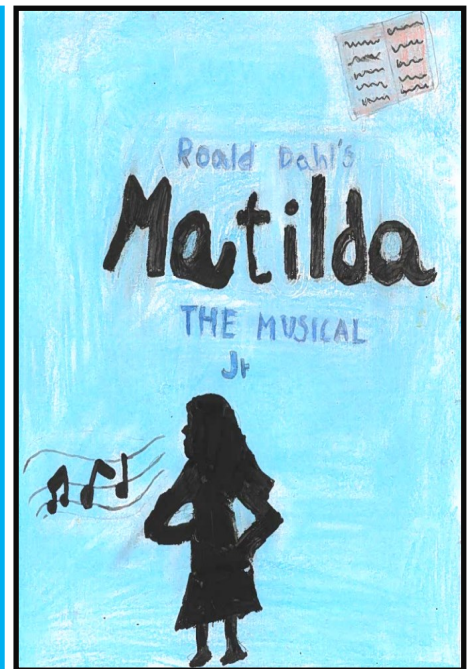
