This week we focused on Safer Internet Day which took place before half term. The theme this year was online scams and phishing. Assemblies were delivered for Treen and Mousehole as a group and Godrevy and Fistral as a group. The children in KS1 were taught how to spot something they shoudn't click on and who to talk to if they do. In KS2 we identified features of common scams and how to avoid them as well as where to report them.

There will also be a change to the advertised menu as shown below!!






DON'T FORGET
