Next week's match will be against Gulval - venue to be confirmed. As always are welcome to come and watch



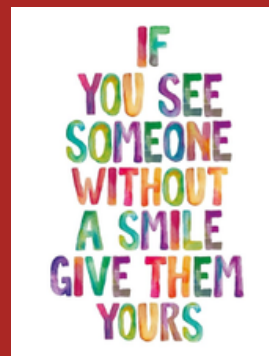

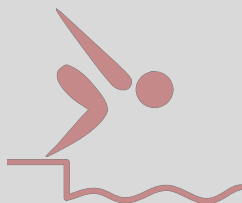
