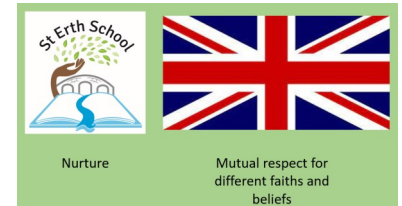
HAPPY BIRTHDAY!
